

Kazunzu - Village of Hope


Kazunzu – Village of Hope is an exciting new project that we are launching for 2019. It will be the largest building programme the Vine Trust has ever undertaken and has the potential to change many lives, particularly of widows and orphans living on the islands and shores of Lake Victoria in Tanzania.

Through the work of Jubilee Hope, the team and volunteers have witnessed first hand the plight of those living on the islands of Lake Victoria. Whilst the scenery, wildlife and colourful fishing boats paint an idyllic picture, the reality is quite different. The health conditions are poor, many fishermen lose their lives on the Lake each year and the HIV infection rates can be as high as 30% in some communities. There are many widows and orphans living on the islands and we'd like to be able to offer them a brighter future at Kazunzu Village of Hope.

Kazunzu is located approximately 20km west of Mwanza on the shore of Lake Victoria. Our partners at African Inland Church of Tanzania (AICT) have secured a site that is a little over 53 acres in size. During late August and early September, we had a number of meetings with the local Town Planner as well as the District Commissioner. Whilst we need to go through a formal planning process at both regional and national level, we have their support to build a village at the site.

We hope, over the next few years, to build as many as 45 homes, each for a widow and up to six orphans. Houses will be built in clusters of three, with each cluster sharing a small 'shamba', or cottage garden, providing space to grow some crops and keep a few chickens. There will be a primary school and in time, the possibility of a secondary school. There will also be a Vocational Training Centre providing learning opportunities for those in the village and the broader community. Understanding how to run a small shamba and learning a trade at the vocational training centre will hopefully prepare those growing up at Kazunzu for a constructive adult life. It is also our hope that having a "mama" for a small "family" of orphans will help to avoid the institutional feel of an orphanage - a criticism that is sometimes levelled at traditional orphanages.





Sustainability will be key to the success of such a programme and we hope to create an array of income opportunities for the villagers. There will be an area of land set aside for farming cash crops, and we also plan to create a series of fish ponds where the villagers can farm Tilapia, a lucrative fish commonly found in Lake Victoria, which can be more effectively and safely farmed in small ponds. Crafts, income from the Vocational Training Centre and school fees all have the potential to expand the income for villagers.

The project is not without its challenges. We are talking to the local government about extending the current road the last four miles to the site and we welcome the Tanzanian Government's commitment to have electricity to all villages by the end of 2020.

It is a big undertaking and as such we intend to break it down into four phases. The first phase is likely to involve building the first 15 homes as well as the Vocational Training Centre and addressing some of the infrastructure elements such as water and sanitation. Encouragingly, through the support of church groups and corporate supporters we are well positioned for the first phase.

During 2019 we will be building at Kazunzu in addition to our existing programme of homebuilding at Moshi.

Building on our Building Opportunities

It has been an exciting year for our Building programme, with the conception and initial planning of Kazunzu which will expand our volunteering opportunities in 2019 and beyond.

It is also a landmark year for building individual family homes in Moshi, with the completion of our 100th home in partnership with TAWREF (Tanzania Women's Research Foundation). An original target was set to build the 100th home by the end of the 2018 and we were delighted to have reached this milestone by April, 8 months early!

With the incredible support of school teams, a further 8 homes were built over the summer and as our three remaining adult teams prepare to travel to Tanzania across October and November, we hope to have constructed a total of 115 individual homes by the end of 2018. Our volunteers particularly enjoyed the opportunity to visit some of the large children's homes previously built by Vine Trust volunteers in collaboration with our partners Evangelical Lutheran Church of Tanzania (ELCT). Engaging with the children now living in the homes, the visits provided ample playtime and laughter and also the opportunity to see a completed project which has been handed over to our partners and is being managed by them to give local, vulnerable and often orphaned Tanzanian children a helping hand.



The Power of Social Media



In 2018, social media at times has received a somewhat "bad reputation". However, it can also be a tool for empowerment and a great way to tell our stories. We handed our website blogs over to our school volunteers on Building Expeditions this summer during their time in Tanzania and Peru, and were blown away by their reflections:

"Just before we left we got to meet Happiness, who is one of the four siblings who will be living in the house. She is only 15 years old, she said she felt so blessed to have us come along. This put things into perspective that she's only 15 and is counting on our help to build them all this new home."

"I appreciate the little things in my life and this experience has been a real eye-opener, as I realise how lucky I really am.

Not only have we helped them, but they have really helped me."

"As the walls grew so did the delight on the elderly grandmother's face who sat and watched on, graciously thanking us whenever we looked towards her. The day before she had described us as "angels from heaven" and although we may not be that, the sheer happiness and feeling that we were impacting an actual life made us feel something out of this world."

"Seeing this little baby in a small shelter with a firsttime mother in the dark and exposed to bad weather
conditions put into perspective the importance of the
bricks currently being laid with cement outside and
made what we are doing all the more important. It
also made each of us remark on how our own homes
are taken for granted and go far beyond our actual
needs, and what we thought was an essential was
entirely unnecessary to our actual needs."

"As the bus trundles down the road towards the plane that will carry us away from this amazing country, we gaze at the sun as it sets on our time in Tanzania. The thought floating through my mind was, we came here and we can't all change the world, but as we drive away from Lillian I realise we have changed her world, and that's a pretty amazing thing".

Jubilee Hope Programme

April this year marked 3 years since the very first Jubilee Hope Medical Programme expedition to the islands of Lake Victoria, Tanzania. Over this period, through collaboration with local partners and communities, the Jubilee Hope Programme has grown to be the largest health care provider to the islands of the Kagera region, serving multiple locations across 5 island groups and having provided more than 150,000 consultations. Key to the Programme's development have been the partnerships with local communities, African Inland Church Tanzania (AICT) and Anglo Gold Ashanti, who have all played fundamental roles in the incredible progress.

To gain a better understanding of the needs and challenges faced by the communities served by the Programme, Vine Trust commissioned a household survey on the islands of Ikuza and Mazinga. The findings, which clearly highlighted a wide variety of socio-economic and health challenges, will be utilised in the development of the Programme and enable Vine Trust to better tailor its services to the needs of the communities.

Earlier this year, 78 healthcare professional attended Vine Trust's third Medical Conference. Guest speakers Ronald Kebaso (Programme Coordinator, Jubilee Hope) and Maseke Mgabo (Medical Sociologist) presented updates on the growth and impact of the Jubilee Hope Programme since its launch in 2015, as well as initial summary findings from the Household Survey.

Particular emphasis at the conference was given to the activities being undertaken to address the high levels of HIV infection on the islands including the establishment of support groups for women living with HIV, who suffer increased stigma, prejudice and risk of physical violence. Since their launch in 2016, groups have provided orientation, education and access to micro-enterprise initiatives to almost 400 women across the islands served by the Programme.

Global Citizenship in the Scottish National Health Service and the value of overseas volunteering was also emphasised by guest speaker, Mr Stuart Fergusson in reference to the recent 'Global Citizenship' report published by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow.

Since the conference, we have been greatly encouraged by further developments within the Jubilee Hope Programme, having now received full accreditation as an HIV Care and Treatment Centre by the national government. This certification permits the Programme to provide the full complement of HIV services, including the distribution of antiretrovirals to new patients.

Amazon Hope Programme


It is hard to believe that 12 months have already passed since the MV Forth Hope first sailed into Iquitos, its new home, just after dawn on 8th September 2017! Its arrival signalled the end of a 43-day, 6793-mile delivery journey adventure from Scotland but also the beginning of an exciting new expansion for the Amazon Hope Programme.

Just 9 days later, the vessel departed Iquitos en route for the village of Oran on the banks of the Amazon river to start providing medical services. The patients who came aboard were the first of thousands of people who have now received free health consultations on board the Forth Hope. In fact, in its first year of service, MV Forth Hope has been the location where 117,760 primary healthcare consultations been delivered. Incredibly, 111 overseas medical volunteers from 8 countries have also travelled on board, working alongside the Peruvian workers to deliver the vital healthcare services.

Since its arrival, the MV Forth Hope has been working alongside the MV Amazon Hope 2 to visit 5 different river basins over the past 12 months. The extra capacity for service provision has allowed the programme to visit new communities and zones previously unreached by the ships, with an estimated 170,000 consultations being provided in 2018, growing to 200,000 per year from 2019.


